AN ORDINANCE FIXING SALARIES, WAGES AND COMPENSATION for all salaried, appointed and elected Officers within the Borough of Englewood Cliffs, in the County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Englewood Cliffs, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION I. The following salaries, wages and/or compensation shall be paid to the respective employees of the Borough of Englewood Cliffs, for the year 2015, as set forth below:

SECTION II

- A. Longevity for Administrative employees who receive health benefits shall be implemented and supplemented by adding thereto two percent (2%) increase for each four (4) years of service with a maximum of fourteen percent (14%) for twenty eight years of service as a “longevity pay increase.”
- B. Terminal Leave:
- 20 years or more up to 25 years – two (2) months;
 - 25 years or more up to 30 years - three (3) months;
 - 30 or more years – four (4) months;
 - 35 or more years – five (5) months;
 - 40 or more years – six (6) months

SECTION III

Should any part or provision of this Ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part held so unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION IV

Salaries for PBA Local 45 and International Brotherhood of Teamsters Local 97 are determined by collective bargaining agreements as attached.

ORDINANCE 2015-11

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER II, ENTITLED
“ADMINISTRATION” OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES AND REVISED CODE OF THE
BOROUGH OF ENGLEWOOD CLIFFS, SPECIFICALLY SECTION 2-10.12.**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Englewood Cliffs, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that Chapter II, entitled “Administration” of the General Ordinance and Revised Code of the Borough of Englewood Cliffs, is amended and supplemented herein as follows, specifically Section 2-10.12.

2-10.12 Superintendent of Public Works

The position of Superintendent of Public Works shall be on a full time basis and it shall be the duty of the Superintendent to supervise and control the operations of the Department of Public Works and the Road Maintenance Department, at the direction of, and with the advice of the Mayor and Council. The Superintendent shall perform any and all functions referred to him by the Mayor and Council. The Superintendent of the Department of Public Works shall be certified and have all other qualifications and legal requirements as set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:9-154(a) et seq.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to grant Tenure pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:9-154 (a) et seq.

The Superintendent of Department of Public Works who has served continuously in that position for 5 years or more, shall not be removed there from for political or other reasons except for good cause, upon written charges filed with the municipal clerk and after a public, fair and impartial hearing.

The Superintendent may be retired when he or she has obtains the age of 65.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and publication in accordance with the law; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed as to said inconsistencies and conflict, and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that should any part or provision of this Ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any part hereof, other than the part held so unconstitutional or invalid.

This ordinance is passed pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:9-154.6.

All the officers involved should be praised for saving the life of the passenger. There was a recent hijacking of a resident's car which involved a police car chase through several towns. The criminal was arrested with minor injuries to several of the police officers and damaged police vehicles.

The Mayor thanked the Police Department for their excellent work.
